WOOD CABIN

How Life Would Have Been In 1864.

Visit the Wood Cabin to see and hear stories as women and children portray how life would have been in 1864. Re-enactor children will portray orphan children who may have lost their families during the hardship of the war. Women will be demonstrating cooking, drying herbs, sewing, churning butter and the trials of everyday life during this very difficult time.

FREEMAN LOG CABIN

As you enter the Freeman Log Cabin take time to watch a biographical video of Clyde Freeman who lived in this 1840s dog-trot cabin until his death in 1992. The Freeman Log Cabin never had electricity, running water or indoor plumbing.
