#### FREEMAN LOG CABIN

As you enter the Freeman Log Cabin take time to watch a biographical video of Clyde Freeman who lived in this 1840s dog-trot cabin until his death in 1992. The Freeman Log Cabin never had electricity, running water or indoor plumbing.

LANGFORD STORE The building that housed the H.A. Langford store was originally built in the early 1900s and was located in the Holly Springs community. Carol Langford Anglin donated the store in 2020. Restoration is ongoing and will be completed as funds become available.
